
PROTECTYOUR CHILD AVOID BATTERY INGESTION



RISKS

- Lithium button batteries with diameter of 20mm: risk of getting stuck in esophagus
- * Round and shiny: tempting to small children
- If not treated within 2hrs, risk of internal bleeding, chemical burns and chronic health issues

PREVENTION

- Keep out of sight/reach of children and avoid confusion: do not leave batteries near medicines or food
- Buy child-safe packaging only
- Once open, wrap packaging with remaining batteries and battery compartments (toys, other devices) with adhesive strong tape
- C € When purchasing toys, look for secured battery compartments with CE marking
- Properly dispose of used button batteries at official collection points

ACT

Swallowed batteries must be removed immediately!

- Go straight to hospital emergency unit, ideally with pediatric department
- If possible, note battery size (20mm or less)
- On your way: Feed honey to children over 1 year (2tsp every 10min up to 6x)
- Do not provide any drinks/food
- Do not induce vomiting
